The Public Library is continuing to provide curbside service and can process a new library card online or through email. Families simply go to the website <u>chattlibrary.org</u> and select "Get a Library Card" from the top right hand corner. Follow the instructions and library staff will assist you in your application process through email.

There are many benefits for a student having a public library card.

- There is unlimited free access to audiobooks through the library's digital collection: Hoopla, OverDrive, and RB Digital.
